- Had a monthly Area CPC Google Meets meeting Thursday 6th. With Area CPC chair, and 6 92 District CPC chairs. We spent time on the CPC agenda items for 2025 conference. We completed the synopsis sheets, and these can be seen on Area 92 website.
- We discussed the suggested new pamphlets from the agenda list, and it was noted both a new suggested pamphlet covering AA members with mental illness and neuro divergent issues, both would be geared to the professional who may be in contact with the prospective AA member, not for the AA member themselves. It was also noted that the cost to produce a pamphlet was between \$4k-10k.
